- The source of Luke’s information?
- The importance he attached to giving a truthful record?
- His purpose in writing his Gospel narrative?

However, despite Luke using his investigative skills, interviews, research and writing abilities, what can we also be sure of?

D. IMPLICATIONS FOR ME

With what attitude should we approach the Bible?

Why should we trust Luke’s Gospel even if he wasn’t one of the twelve apostles?
