A. DISCUSSION STARTER

What do you live for?

What keeps you going in life?

B. FROM THE BIBLE

Jesus' identity is questioned in the text:

1. Where else in Luke's gospel have we seen Jesus' identity being questioned? (Lk. 8:25).
2. What are the details surrounding that? (Lk. 9:7-9).
3. Who was Herod the Tetrarch? And what is the significance of him questioning Jesus' identity considering this?

In verses 1 & 2, Jesus calls and then sends his disciples away to "proclaim the kingdom of God and heal." What was peculiar about the instructions that follow, and why? (v. 3-6).

How many people were within the crowd that had followed Jesus? (v. 14).

How much food did Jesus and the disciples have? (v. 13).

How is this dilemma solved, and what is the significance of this?

C. IMPLICATIONS FOR ME

Are you sure of Jesus' identity? Why or why not?

What does it mean to be one of the King's sent ones?

When we evangelise, according to this passage, what are we inviting people to?

If Jesus is able to satisfy us, beyond what is even necessary, why do we continue to chase satisfaction from other things?
