- 1. Which group of people do you most identify with? (15:1) What's the lesson for you from Jesus' parable?
- 2. How do you view the Fatherhood of God? Does it line up to the father's extravagant actions is this parable?
- 3. Is there any history of sin that would be too immense for God to forgive? What would repentance look like for you? Do you think God would welcome you?
- 4. Could the older brother's pride be something we might be tempted with? Cf. v29. What's the lesson for us?
