KING FOR ALL #40 Luke's Gospel

Title: Faith Passage: Luke 17:1-19



- 1. Faith takes spiritual care for others (v1-2)
- 2. Faith is forgiving (v3-4)
- 3. Faith is like a mustard seed (v5-6)
- 4. Faith is serving humbly and dutifully (v7-10)
- 5. Faith is grateful (v11-19)

B. DISCUSSION STARTER

What are the benefits of going for regular medical checkups? How can we do this spiritually speaking for our Christian walk?



- 1. V1-2. Can we expect sinless perfection in this world? How were the Pharisees causing others to stumble and sin?
- 2. V3-4. Jesus seems to be talking about sins and offenses in the Christian community. Does Jesus place a limit on our forgiveness?
- 3. V5-6. The point is that it is not the *amount* of faith that counts, but the *presence* of faith.



- 4. V7-10. What is the attitude of the servant/ slave?
- 5. V11-19. What marks the Samaritan apart from the other nine lepers? Why is this surprising?

D. IMPLICATIONS FOR ME

- 1. V1-2. How might we live in such a manner that we keep others from following Jesus or cause the followers of Jesus to stumble? Do we consider the good of others when we make decisions?
- V3-4. Unforgiveness severely hampers family and church fellowship. Forgiveness does not minimize or condone the sin or offense against us. Forgiveness means that we leave the judgement up to God as we release that person from the debt they owe us. (cf. Romans 12:16-21) Do you harbour a grudge against someone, perhaps someone in our church? What should you do? Why are we called to forgive? Why is forgiveness difficult?

Note on Forgiveness:

For reconciliation to take place, there must be *repentance* by the offending party. Without repentance there may never be reconciliation. However, even when there is no repentance, Christians are called to *forgive* just as God forgave us. Forgiveness also does not mean we should not take wise, appropriate steps. E.g., A wife may forgive her abusive husband but still separates and files for divorce.

- 3. V5-6. Why is it so encouraging that it's not about the amount of faith we have, but the object of our faith that counts?
- 4. V7-10. You may have been a Christian and serving for many years. Are you at times tempted to think that God is in your debt and He should be extremely thankful for your awesome ministry? How could we engage in Christian ministry for selfish reason? How should be think about Christian life and ministry?
- 5. V11-19. Do you tend to be like the Nine, taking God's grace for granted, or like the One who was super grateful for Jesus?



For yourself

Thank God for his grace and kindness to you in Christ.

Thank God that He has forgiven all your offenses and sins again His "divine majesty". Thank God for Jesus who was the worthy servant for us unworthy servants in order for us to be considered worthy.

Thank God for the immense privilege of serving in Christian ministry.

Ask God to help you forgive those who have sinned against you.
